## Master's Degree Programme in Disaster Management

### Student selection in Rolling admission (January 2027 intake)

Note! To be considered in student selection for the programme, you are required to submit the application form on Studyinfo.fi service during the application period and meet the eligibility requirements for the studies. For the Rolling admission (January 2027 intake) the application opens on 15 May 2026 and closes when the study places reserved for the programme have been filled or on 15 August 2026 at the latest.

The student selection for this master's degree programme beginning in January 2027 is based on a written pre-task and an interview. The **written pre-task** consists of **two documents** that must be submitted. Complete both documents before applying and upload the pre-task to your application form. If you meet the requirements and pass the pre-task, you are invited to an interview. Students in the Rolling Admission process are selected based on the points from the written pre-task and the interview. Make sure you have all the required documents in your application.

#### Upload your written pre-task to your application form on Studyinfo.

Complete the written pre-task and remember to check that both documents are included. **Save the changes to the application form after the upload.** You must both upload the files and save the changes. **Note! The written pre-task is required in English!**

### Written pre-task

#### 1. CV

Include a recent facial photo of yourself in the CV (can be informal). Europass CV format is recommended, please see instructions for it here:

#### 2. Written assignment

Ensure that your response covers all required points. Answer using complete sentences, not using dashes. The maximum length of answers is two pages using 1.5-line spacing.

1. Reflecting on your educational and professional history, why are you applying to the Master's degree programme in Disaster Management?
2. Evaluate your own study readiness realistically.
3. Describe your current life situation and how it affects your ability to study.
4. Propose a preliminary development or research idea that you could carry out during your studies, for example as your master's thesis.
